RETURNED TO SENDER



Kildrostan St Post Office will be closed in April.

After a six-week consultation, during which 1,300 people signed a petition against the closure, the Post Office became one of more than 20 to be closed in Glasgow this year. The Post Office has served the local community for more than a century. Sally Buchanan, the Post Office's Network Development Manager for Scotland stated, "These are difficult decisions which have not been taken lightly. We have considered very carefully all the comments made during the public consultation." Councillor David Meikle, who campaigned strongly against the closure, said, "This decision flies in the face of common sense and the evidence presented to them. It is a travesty for the local community and businesses in Pollokshields." Only two of the offices proposed for closure were saved, both in the West

End.



Residents across the Southside have been campaigning against an unusual business proposal for Pollok Park, recently voted the best park in Europe. Campaigners claim the plan will result in disruption, noise and vandalism and affect the quality of life for residents and local park users.

Glasgow City Council had been minded to grant planning consent for the development of a "high-wire adventure facility" in the woods of Pollok Park, to be operated by a company called Go Ape. Go Ape would receive a 21-year lease and in return provide a "forest adventure course of rope bridges, Tarzan swings and zip slides, all set high up in the tree tops."

The adventure facility is planned for the North Wood, within sight of the Burrell Collection. Supporters said it would encourage children to be more active in the outdoors and give tourists another reason to visit the city and use the park.

What began as a small campaign against

What began as a small campaign against the proposal, and critical of the consultation process undertaken, has gathered momentum with Nicola Sturgeon, the Maxwell family and the National Trust for Scotland adding their voice to the campaign against the introduction of this facility into the council-run park. The council has received 148 letters of support

for the proposal and 881 objections. Hundreds attended a vigil at the park in February and, due to their pressure, the planning committee decided to defer making a decision until a site visit and hearing on March 25th. As this newsletter went to press, the hearing was held and the Planning Applications Committee voted 14-6 in favour of the proposal. The application will now, however, be referred to MSPs for approval, as the Council has a financial interest in the application. Protestors are also looking at legal issues concerning the planning process. Councillor David Meikle was one of those who voted against the application and said, "I can see the benefits of a Go Ape facility but I, like thousands of people across Glasgow, feel very strongly that the North Wood of Pollok Country Park is an unsuitable location for what is proposed."
